Venue

Shuttle Service: 90-minute Bus Ride

A Coach Service has been organised for delegates attending the meeting. The coach will pick up delegates from the Adelaide Airport (Coach bay outside the arrivals section of the Terminal) at 1100 or at 1300 on Monday 18 October, followed by stops at the Adelaide Convention Centre (just down from the escalators) at 1130 and 1330. A return shuttle is also available on Thursday 21 October departing at 1400 from the Novotel Barossa, stopping at the Adelaide Convention Centre at 1530 and Adelaide Airport at 1600. **You must indicate on the registration form if you require the shuttle service.**

Outback Trail Options

Tour 1 **\$660.00** **Hills Mallee Fleurieu – Showcasing the Parallel Rural Community Curriculum** Departing Sunday 17 October Pickup: Adelaide Convention Centre, North Tce, Adelaide at 0830

Spend time taking in the best of the Southern Fleurieu region of South Australia while also being introduced to local medical staff and students who will showcase the full year longitudinal integrated student clerkship known as the Parallel Rural Community Curriculum. Goolwa, a town rich in the history of railway and paddle steamer transportation, is located at the end of the famous Murray River and is now a well known tourist destination. Victor Harbor, also a well known tourist destination, is the home of the horse drawn tram to Granite Island. Murray Bridge and Mannum are both significant River Murray towns, one being a regional city, the other a town and community whose background is closely linked to the rural nature of local enterprise and the history of transportation of wool and wheat down the river to the port of Goolwa. Spend time in discussion with local clinicians and student preceptors who are passionate about ensuring the provision of medical education in rural areas.

Day 1

Travel to the Southern Fleurieu, stopping off at points of interest along the way before arriving in Victor Harbor for a trip on the horse drawn tram to Granite Island. You can choose whether to be active and walk around the island or elect to enjoy the scenery and coffee at the shop / restaurant. We will then take the historic train trip to the River port town of Goolwa, where we will visit the local medical centre and talk with local clinicians, preceptors and current students. Our bus will transfer us back to the McCracken Country Club in Victor Harbor where you will be free to explore the golf course or relax and enjoy the facilities before your evening meal.

Day 2

From Victor Harbor we will travel to the Murray River towns of Murray Bridge and Mannum, where you will once again have the opportunity to meet with local clinicians and note the different characteristics of these towns. Over lunch at the Pretoria Hotel in Mannum you will be able to enjoy classic Murray River Scenery. We will travel to the Barossa Valley in ample time for registration, arriving mid afternoon.

Tour 2 **\$660.00** **Riverland – Growing Your Own Health Professional Workforce** Departing Sunday 17 October Pickup: Adelaide Convention Centre, North Tce, Adelaide at 0830

The Riverland is a unique agricultural region on the banks of the mighty River Murray. The region is internationally renowned for innovation in irrigation. It is also the pioneer site of the Parallel Rural Community Curriculum, the Rural Paramedic Program, the first simulation unit in rural Australia and the mobile simulation van.

This outback trail will allow you to see for yourself a harsh desert which has been transformed into the fruit bowl of Australia and to meet with local health professionals, local community members and students. Hear their stories of how the Riverland, with a dearth of health workforce has become the national engine driver for rural health workforce development, as they demonstrate how they have harnessed their local resources to grow their own workforce.

Day 1

On your journey you will visit the beautiful town of Waikerie, meet local clinicians and community members and lunch at the internationally recognised Banrock Station – Wine & Wetland Centre, Travel on to Renmark for a relaxing cruise along the Murray River hosted by Lecturer in Interprofessional Education, Lyn Gum with staff and students from Flinders University Rural Clinical School. Sunday night dinner will be held at the award-winning themed restaurant, The Mallee Fowl. Good food served in an old shearing shed filled with an eclectic array of Australian memorabilia.

Day 2

Enjoy a leisurely walk along the river front in Berri before heading off to visit the Flinders University Rural Clinical School in Renmark, including a tour and training session in the Simulation Centre. Consider how to use your clinical space in creative and versatile ways to provide high quality interprofessional clinical simulation with a focus on quality debriefing. Enjoy lunch on the riverfront at the Renmark Club, before travelling back to the Barossa Valley, arriving sometime around 4.30 p.m.

Tour 3 **\$660.00** **Flinders Ranges – Vertical Integrated Training in the Outback** Departing Saturday 16 October Pickup: Adelaide Convention Centre, North Tce, Adelaide at 0830

This tour will showcase general practices in rural South Australia which provide vertically integrated clinical training for GP registrars, interns and medical students from both Adelaide and Flinders Universities. Outback trail guests will have an opportunity to meet with GP supervisors, learners and educators in four rural practices while gaining a perspective of this beautiful region.

Day 1

You will head north from Adelaide to the Clare Valley region for a practice visit in this premier wine growing district. Travel onto Jamestown for a second practice visit and overnight at Wilpena Pound Resort, set amidst the vibrant colours of the 800 million-year-old quartzite and limestone outcrop that is the Flinders Ranges. This place has strong significance to the indigenous Adnyamathanha people.

Day 2

An early start will see an opportunity for free time, scenic flights, walking or 4WD tours (at your own cost). We will travel through historic Hawker before arriving in Quorn, where we will spend time with the local GP and stay overnight.

Day 3

You will commence the day with a walk up Devil's Peak before meeting up with rural doctors from practices in Port Pirie and Crystal Brook. After lunch you will head through the Barossa Valley to join others at the conference venue.

Other Activities Outside Conference Program

Activities will be arranged to assist in work/life balance. Choosing to attend one of these sessions will give you an opportunity to network with other likeminded people.

On each day there will be five concurrent sessions, one will be a two hour activity away from the meeting rooms. Suggested sessions thus far are 'green thumb', Kegel 9 pin bowling, golf, scenic walk, and tennis. Registration for these sessions will be available when the detailed program is released after 1 July. In the meantime here are some tour options you might like to plan for outside of the conference meeting times.

Golf

Tanunda Pines Golf Club is located adjacent to the Novotel Barossa Valley Resort and is a stunning 18 hole, par 72, championship golf course. Home to an abundance of native bird and animal life, one hundred year old gum trees line fairways that undulate across hilltops with views over Jacob's Creek and St Hallett vineyards from several vantage points. Established in 1938, this now privately owned public access course has recently undergone a transformation with the introduction of six newly designed holes, elevating it to one of Australia's finest regional woodlands golf courses. The South Australia PGA Championship which is an Australasian Von Nida Tour event was held here in 2006. The club also hosts events such as the Jacobs Creek Classic, the Holden Scramble, and many other smaller and more intimate annual events for members, visitors and groups.

Conference Speakers

Barbara Ogur – Continuity

M.D., FACP/Associate Professor of Medicine, Harvard Medical School



Dr. Barbara Ogur, M.D. is a graduate of Radcliffe College and the Abraham Lincoln School of Medicine of the University of Illinois. She did her Internal Medicine residency at Cook County Hospital in Chicago, Illinois. She is an Associate Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School. For the last 24 years has been a primary care physician at a community health center of the Cambridge Health Alliance, an affiliate of Harvard Medical School. Dr. Ogur has dedicated her career to providing healthcare to the under-served, and to the innovative education of socially-conscious medical students. In 2004 she co-developed and now co-directs, with Dr. David Hirsh, the Harvard Medical School-Cambridge Integrated Clerkship, a year-long, experience to teach the core clinical disciplines through engaging

third-year medical students in the longitudinal care of patients. This innovative program has been cited along with other similar longitudinal integrated programs by the Carnegie study on the preparation of students for the medical profession as a model for a more humanistic education of physicians. To provide support and guidance to other educators interested in the model, Dr. Ogur was a founding member and is an active participant in the Consortium of Longitudinal Integrated Clerkships.

Alison Lee – Inter-Professional Education for the Future

Professor of Education and Director of the Centre for Research in Learning and Change at the University of Technology, Sydney

Alison Lee is Professor of Education and Director of the Centre for Research in Learning and Change at the University of Technology, Sydney. She has researched and published extensively in higher and professional education, with a particular focus on doctoral education and on the changing relations between the university and the professions. Most recently she has led research teams investigating changing health practices and their implications for workforce development, practice development and health professional education. She is currently investigating the changing role of the health consumer, partnership practice in health care and interprofessional learning and practice.

Malcolm Cox – Health Professional Education for the Future

M.D., Chief Academic Affiliations Officer for the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs

Malcolm Cox, M.D. has been the Chief Academic Affiliations Officer for the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) since 2006. Prior to this, he was a principal architect of curriculum reform at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine and Harvard Medical School, where he served as Associate Dean for Clinical Education and Dean for Medical Education, respectively. Over the past four years, Dr Cox has led a major expansion of VA's clinical training programs and has repositioned VA as a major voice in health professions workforce reform, educational innovation and research, leadership development and organisational transformation.

Dr Arjun Karki – Community Engagement

Professor of Internal Medicine and Medical Education, Patan Academy of Health Sciences, Kathmandu, Nepal

Dr Arjun Karki, MD is the founding Vice Chancellor of the Patan Academy of Health Sciences (PAHS), appointed by the Government of Nepal. Dr Karki worked as the member-secretary of the Medical School Steering Committee (MSSC) from 2003 and PAHS Project coordinator from 2007. He was also the Chief of the Medicine Department of the Patan Hospital. The Patan Academy of Health Sciences is dedicated to the sustained improvement of the health of the people of Nepal, especially those who are poor and living in rural areas, through innovation, equity, excellence and love in education, service and research. It has commenced recruitment of its first cohort of students this year.
